NATHAN MOREAU OF NATHAN MOREAU PHOTOGRAPHY finds the current trend in engagement photos is shooting in a more natural location, rather than a traditional studio environment. Couples pick locations like the beach, local fair, college campus, ski mountains, downtown Boston, Fenway Park, and any place meaningful to them. “Often times, it will be the place where they first met!” says Nathan. He will plan the shoot based on the weather. “For example, I had a couple that insisted on taking pictures when it was snowing, so I watched the weather until snow was in the forecast.”

Nathan always encourages every couple that books him for their wedding to take advantage of the engagement session, which is included in all his packages. “Wedding pictures are great but let’s face it nobody wears their tux and dress every day. The engagement session is about capturing the lifestyle of a young couple in love.”
